Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS)

A PERS is an electronic device designed to let you summon help in an emergency. When emergency help (medical, fire or police) is needed, the PERS user presses the transmitter's help button. A radio signal is sent to the console, which automatically dials one or more pre-selected emergency telephone numbers.
